

Regulation for the 2023 EuPA Best Doctoral Thesis Award

Aim of the award

With the EuPA Best Doctoral Thesis Award, the European Proteomics Association (EuPA) intends to honour a young PhD who presented an outstanding thesis in any field of proteomics in 2022 or 2023.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the applicant must fulfil the following criteria.

- The applicant must be a member of a EuPA member society.¹
- The applicant must not have previously applied for the EuPA Best Doctoral Thesis Award.

Selection procedure

The EuPA Awards Committee members will score the application based on the answers provided in the form and using the following criteria:

- Originality
- Impact in the proteomics field and/or other fields
- Publications as (shared) first author
- Communications (talks, posters, seminars)
- Community and outreach activities

Award presentation

The EuPA Best Doctoral Thesis recipient will be honoured with a plate with name and recognition, a free registration fee for the upcoming 2024 HUPO-EuPA conference (sponsored by the congress organisation) and will be invited to give a talk during a future online event for ECRs, organised by the EuPA Education Committee.
