

Regulation for the 2023 EuPA Science Outreach Award

Aim of the award

With the EuPA Science Outreach Award, the European Proteomics Association (EuPA) intends to support an individual or a group of individuals in undertaking an outreach activity. The award is intended to acknowledge those who have been active in organising science outreach activities or participating in such events and enabling future events. The EuPA Awards Committee defines an *outreach activity* as any event aiming to divulge and/or popularise science in general or any science topic to a non-scientific audience.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the applicant must fulfil the following criteria.

- The applicant must be a member of a EuPA member society.¹
- The applicant must not have previously been awarded the EuPA SOA award.

Selection procedure

The EuPA Awards Committee members will score the application based on the answers provided in the form and using the following criteria:

- Past organised outreach activities including originality, description, place and number of attendees.
- Outreach activity proposal if winning the award, including originality, description, place, number of potential attendees and use of the prize money.

Award presentation

The EuPA Science Outreach Award will receive a prize of €1,000 to be used to organise a science outreach event, will be honoured with a plate with name and recognition, will be granted free registration fees for the upcoming 2024 HUPO-EuPA conference (sponsored by the congress organisation) and will be named 'EuPA Outreach Ambassador' for that year with a special mention in the newsletter and on the website.
